

# Renew This Sanctuary: Building Shelter for Prayer and Praise

Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? 1 Corinthians 3:16

As Christians, images of the Jewish Temple occupy a strange place in our history and theology. When the Temple was destroyed, two religions were created: synagogue-based Judaism, and church-based Christianity. The Sanctuary where one could draw near to the

Most High was moved theologically, down from the prow of the hill and into the midst of the people. Christ became the replacement for any lingering allegiance to the sacrificial system in Christianity; we are no longer sacrificial, we are free in Christ Jesus.

If Jesus was the final sacrifice (see Hebrews 10, also note the related image of Jesus as the eternal High Priest in Hebrews 7), Sanctuary has to mean more than the place of sacrifice (note the pivot here away from traditional stewardship theology). Sanctuary is a container, a social energy that allows for a journey of transformation. It is created by how people move together through space, not by the space itself. Sanctuary is a vibe, a resonant harmony, a sense of being held, called, expanded. Sanctuary is what *good church* feels like. Stewardship is about taking care of the Sanctuary.

The journey through Sanctuary starts with the disruption of the norm; Sanctuary might be a place to flee, or rest, or just breathe slower for a minute. Sanctuary is **Sacred** in the truest sense of the word: it is set apart. We create and steward Sanctuary by remembering that as much as we are responsible for in our lives, there is One greater than us who carries it all. We disrupt norms of scarcity, of urgency, of "having to have it right". We learn to trust in a God bigger than our understanding.

The expanded and expansive God abides in a *Majestic* Sanctuary, a place of great wonder and awe. The complexity of matter and energy, the power of beauty, the expanse of the heavens, all of the greatness of God is magnified and amplified, encountered and felt, never fully understood. We steward Sanctuary by remembering and sharing beauty in dark times, when all can seem callous and cruel.

Facing the painful parts of life reminds us of our need for community, for the buoyancy of love and care that keeps the rough water from taking us under. We need a *Liturgical* Sanctuary where we organize our individual efforts into communal efforts. The word in Greek (*leitourgia*) literally translates "work or service for the people". All of our life is rooted in God, and all of our gifts are shared with us by God, but are distributed amongst us in disparate ways. We steward Sanctuary by creating a structure through which to magnify our power to enact the Love of God.

As we grow in our ability to serve and connect with others, we come to find that we are not ultimately separate from one another. Our Creator has called us children, called us beloved, called us all to be one family in Christ Jesus. Our Sanctuary becomes *Incarnational* when we allow ourselves to feel with one another, to share in the flow of healing and compassion together. Our bodies are honored, engaged, blessed, and enlivened in true Sanctuary. We steward Sanctuary by seeking after abundant life, remembering that His sacrifice was to free us from sacrifice, so that we could love our bodies, and other bodies unlike ours, as part of the One Body. We find the Body of Christ everywhere in Sanctuary.

This month we will be spending time in St. Paul's letter to the Philippians. We will look at these four attributes of Sanctuary, considering what they mean for our community as we continue to convene and hold Sanctuary in West Seattle. I encourage you to read the book of Philippians a few times this month (it's 4 chapters, so not too long). There is also a great animated Do Justice




#### **CHRISTMAS MARKET COMMITTEE**


